Inspired Facility Project (Club Room Redevelopment)

Sailability at Ulley SC

The club is now registered as an RYA Sailability Centre which means that we are able to offer opportunities to sail for persons with certain disabilities, whether their desire is leisure sailing, racing or formal sailing lessons. We have indicated that we can accept ambulant, hearing-impaired, and blind would-be sailors as well as those with learning difficulties. Through Sailability over 53,000 young people and adults with disabilities are introduced to sailing each year, with many going on to sail on a regular basis at some 202 RYA-recognised clubs and centres across the country. Boating is one of the very few sports in which able-bodied sailors and disabled sailors can participate on equal terms. There are many opportunities for people with a disability to get afloat on all types of boats at such centres.



You will have noticed the new, alarmed, disabled toilet and changing area in the clubhouse and the work done over the winter to upgrade the access ramps on some of our outer doors. It is intended that **our pedestrian access will change to the gate to the left of the parking ticket machine** rather than the one we have used for years to the right hand side (do not try to enter by the right hand gate as it is barred for good reason and the lock has been changed). Finally our new jetty to facilitate disabled access is a project in progress.

At Ulley issues relating to the availability of suitable boats have been resolved after discussions with the Schools Activity Centre. We are now able to provide some specially adapted boats and equipment for disabled persons to use, with access boats such as the two-person Hansa 303 of which there are three which we share with the Schools, as well as the Wayfarer, RS Visions and Qubas. Please note we already have members at Ulley SC who are registered as disabled persons who sail in their unadapted boats with little apparent difficulty! Dave Staniforth will be acting as a team leader for Sailability activities and is willing to discuss any concerns that you may have in relation to this project.

However disabled sailors, when asked about what is important to them say that what is needed at a club like ours is a friendly support network, which entails two or three people coming to help with rigging and getting afloat on the occasions a session has been arranged and confirmed. The session may be a training-based sail with an instructor or a leisure sail for those who have some experience but the general idea is to make the sessions enjoyable and for all involved to come back for more. Ulley SC has always been a friendly and inclusive place to sail and I am sure that we can make the Sailability initiative work and so share our amazing hobby.

Chernobyl Children's Life Line

Supporting children affected by the aftermath of the Chernobyl nuclear disaster

You may recall that last summer Ulley Sailing Club took a group of six children from Chernobyl Children's Life Line (CCLL) for a sail one evening. The six children really enjoyed their evening on the lake as this was something that they would never get the opportunity to do back home in Belarus and all rated it 5 out of 5! The host families enjoyed the evening in a great setting (and our great bar prices) and of course our members enjoyed taking part and were kind enough to offer their time and share their boats. We hope to host a visit again this summer.

CCLL is looking for families that could help during the visit this year. They have a group of children arriving from Belarus on July 16th for 4 weeks and need families/couples that could either host (have the child stay with them) or support (help to look after the children during the day). Hosting is for either 2 or 4 weeks. A full itinerary is planned during the visit. Host families don't need to be able to speak Russian, just offer a caring environment.

CCLL is also looking for businesses/clubs that could help during the visit by supplying goods/services/donations etc. It is also collecting good quality second hand clothing for the children to take home with them, especially winter coats.
